The Interlake Community Foundation provides the citizens of Rockwood, Rosser, Stonewall, Teulon and Woodlands with the opportunity to invest in the future of their community forever. The Foundation pools gifts in capital funds that remain in perpetuity providing citizens with a means of permanently endowing their region and helping to shape its future. The income generated from the capital is distributed as grants to local registered charities. To date, we have over \$10,300,000 in assets! We aim to be the one-stop donation shop for local donors, and are working to increase our All Communities Fund to be able to support more local projects.

Local organizations can apply for grants to fund local projects. Having established broad and flexible criteria, the Foundation can support innovative activities that might not be funded in any other way. Deadline for applications is February 28th of each year. www.interlakefoundation.ca

# Report from Pob Beck | BOARD CHAIR, MAY 2021

Need I say that 2020 was quite the year? It has been a struggle in many ways with all the restrictions and our thoughts are with those who suffered losses.

The ICF participated in two rounds of Emergency Community Support Fund granting in partnership with Community Foundations of Canada and the Government of Canada. We approved grants totalling \$70,000, supporting our local communities in helping vulnerable Canadians deal with the health, social and economic impacts of the pandemic.

The ICF participated in the Fund for Gender Equality. We approved \$60,000 in grants to 5 local organizations who supported programs at the heart of the women's movement. Their activities, leadership, mission, and vision are committed to advancing gender equality and we were pleased to be able to assist them. The Fund for Gender Equality was supported by a collaboration between Community Foundations of Canada and the Equality Fund, with support from the Government of Canada.

We have just completed the 2021 Community Grant Approvals (see page 8 for the full list). As usual, we did not have enough funds available to fully fund every qualifying project. One priority we have set is to grow our All Communities Fund, also known as the unrestricted fund. These funds come from donations from people and businesses who want to help their community without putting restrictions in place so that the ICF Board can direct the funds to where they are most needed every year. We hope to be seen as a "one stop donation shop" for our local communities.

In 2020, we experienced a huge increase in our charitable assets, with the primary increase coming from the Manitoba government establishing a \$6 million endowment fund with the Foundation to support the Oak Hammock Marsh Interpretive Centre, which has been renamed the Harry J Enns Wetlands Centre to honour an Interlake resident who was a driving force behind the creation of this valuable resource. The new endowment will provide permanent, stable funding to support the interpretive centre and builds upon \$1.5 million in provincial funds committed earlier this year to support upgrades to the facility. We are grateful to the Province of Manitoba for this investment in our community.

We are extremely pleased to share the news that we had 15 new funds created since last May. Our Foundation continues to grow, allowing us to provide increased and ongoing support for our communities. I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to those individuals, families and businesses who have invested in our communities. Our board is always ready to discuss the opportunities available to give back.

Our next event is the 16th Annual Ralph R Eichler Charity Golf Tournament. We are again partnering with Mr. Eichler and South West District Palliative Care to host the fund raising tournament on August 13, 2021 at the beautiful Teulon Golf and Country Club. I would like to close by thanking all of our donors, volunteers, and people who volunteer at the organization that we support. Your commitment and support are what makes our communities grow and remain a wonderful place to call home.

It only gets better every year for the Interlake Community Foundations' ability to support our communities. That's the way we like it and the grant committee is pleased to provide this brief report on our activities this year.



In 2021 we received 16 applications for our community grants program. Our committee made the decision to fund 14 of these grants. As usual our committee's aim is to focus our grant money where it will serve the larger segment of our population to its best advantage. In 2021 we were able to direct \$25,539 back into our supporting communities for their projects. As Covid still prevents an in-person award evening, please check on social media and our website for details coming in the near future on these deserving organizations. As the foundation responsible for the Harry J Enns Oak Hammock Marsh Fund we were able to direct \$294,540 into Ducks Unlimited Canada Oak Hammock Marsh for their projects. With our annual scholarship and designated funds that support the

youth of the area added into our grant allocation for 2021, we are giving \$397,823 out to deserving community organizations to help them achieve their goals in 2021.
