To date, we have over \$11,200,000 in net assets! We aim to be the one-stop donation shop for local donors, and are working to increase our All Communities Fund to be able to support more local charitable organizations.

Local charities can apply to our Community Granting Program each year for their capital projects that meet our requirements. Deadline for applications is February 28th of each year.

We also help donors create a lasting legacy through a donation to an existing fund or by creating a new one. We are here to serve our communities! Please contact us for any information.

Report from Pob Peck | BOARD CHAIR, MAY 2022

We survived another mixed up year in 2021 and I look forward to not having to lead off my report in 2023 with these words. Thank you to everyone for your patience and support of each other as we all pull together in our communities.

The ICF and our board was again busy in 2021 with another rewarding year, as we continued to expand our funds, our assets and our grants. We added 7 new funds in 2021, bringing us to over 60 permanent funds. Our endowed funds grew by almost \$1 million and we provided grants of over \$400,000. It is a great feeling to know that we provided this assistance to our communities to help them with their projects.

We have just received confirmation that we will be participating in the Communities for Gender Equality, which is a multi-year collaboration between Community Foundations of Canada ("CFC") and the Equality Fund, with support from the Government of Canada. We will have \$40,000 in grant funds available. More details to follow.

2021 finally allowed us to get together again and we were able to host the 16th Annual Ralph Eichler Charity Golf Tournament in August with our first sell-out. Unfortunately we were again unable to host our annual grant celebration evening in 2021, but this will be back on track in May 2022. Grants night is a tremendous evening as the local groups are able to share their stories and the projects they are working on (plus there's usually dainties to sample).

Another wonderful program that the ICF has participated in is the Endow Manitoba Giving Challenge. Each November there is an opportunity to grow our unrestricted assets. This is an important area for us as the unrestricted assets allow us to help projects in any community that is part of the ICF. Donations in the past have been matched by the Manitoba government, the Winnipeg Foundation and local resident Lloyd Jensen. Last year alone, we raised over \$60,000 during this one week period. A big thank you to everyone who donated as well as our benefactors who made this a tremendous success. Stay tuned for details on the 2022 challenge as we look to build on this opportunity.

Our Foundation continues to grow, and I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to those individuals, families and businesses who have invested in our communities. I would also like to thank all of the people who volunteer with the organizations that we support. Your commitment and support is what makes our communities grow and remain a wonderful place to call home.

Report from Cheryle McClure, Grants Chair

This year we were able to grant out \$30,828 to 19 organizations that support our communities. As well scholarships will go out to our three high schools in our area to support the future educational goals of the hard-working young adults that they are being awarded to. This amount is over \$19,000. We were able to award over \$317,500 to designated organizations that have special funds set up for them that pay out directly once a year for their programs. Without the support of everyone in our communities that have created these legacies the Interlake Community Foundation would not be able to give back over \$366,000 wonderful in funding this year. If anyone wishes to start a new fund to support a special part of your community or project dear to you, we are willing to work out a package that will provide an ongoing legacy. This year we were able to help several new funds start up for projects that will benefit many organizations around the area.



The Boyer Family opened the "Ethan Boyer Memorial - Tin for the Critter Bin Fund" to continue the support for local pet rescue charities. When Ethan's 2019 accident took his life, Dana, Sue and Reid focused their energy on the Tin for the Critter Bin campaign, which raised donated pet food for rescues. This legacy fund will accept donations (eligible for a donation receipt) and give an annual grant to a rescue charity as chosen by the Boyers.



Report from Murray Slagerman, Marketing Chair Public awareness of the foundation movement and visibility of ICF's work to support charities in our community has been the focus of marketing efforts planned by marketing committee members, Meechelle Best, Ross Thompson, Peggy Linklater, Sandra Smith, Tracy Holod, and Murray Slagerman.

Social media posts on Facebook engage our 1,319
Facebook & 393 Instagram followers, with a range of topics such as grant announcements, deadlines & award highlights; scholarship application and recipient highlights; and new fund information such as Save the Kilns & Community Builder funds. In 2021 the 24-7 Challenge was supported by videos featuring our Reeves and Mayors in support of ICF and highlighting volunteer efforts in our communities.

ICF has amazing support from the Stonewall-Teulon Tribune, for which we are very grateful. A series of articles highlight significant ICF activity providing our most significant exposure along with ad placements. This year we initiated Will Week featuring webinars with The Winnipeg Foundation. The plan is to build into an in-person event in 2023.
