

## Report from ICF Board Chair, Bob Beck, May 2023

From our beginnings in 1994, we have seen tremendous growth within our Foundation thanks to the tireless work of our current board, past board and community. As mentioned in this newsletter, we granted over \$400,000 in 2022. Pretty impressive considering we started with \$300,000 from our initial capital building challenge.

I can't thank our communities enough for the support they have shown us, with their donations and the new funds that are started each year. It is also evident when we host the annual Ralph Eichler Charity Golf Tournament in conjunction with South West District Palliative Care. We've enjoyed sell-outs for the past few years and look forward to another great event on Friday, June 9th in Teulon.

The ICF is proud to have worked with community foundations across Canada as part of the Community Services Recovery Fund. This fund is a collaboration between the Canadian Red Cross, Community Foundations of Canada, and United Way Centraide Canada to provide funding to Community Service Organizations, including non-profit organizations, Indigenous Governing Bodies or Registered Charities located in Canada. Stay tuned as there are some exciting things happening in our communities we are proud to be a part of.

Volunteerism is about helping your communities, and our annual Grants Celebration is a great testimony to that when we see the numerous groups that are out there. We like to be the silent partner helping out in the background and look forward to providing continued support.

It is exciting when we see the next wave learning about volunteering, such as was exhibited by the Stonewall Blues U11 Hockey Team. You're never too young to learn the importance of and how much fun volunteering can be.

#### Report from Cheryle McClure, Grants Chair

In 2023, **\$33,810** was granted to 16 local charties for our Community Granting Program.

Scholarships will go out to our three high schools in our area to support the future educational goals of the hard-working young adults that they are being awarded to. This amount is over \$22,000.

We were able to award over \$326,000 to local charities that have designated funds set up for them that pay out directly once a year for their programs.

We participated in the Fund for Gender Equality Granting program, in partnership with Community Foundations of Canada and the Government of Canada, and awarded the Joy Smith Foundation \$40,000 for their Interlake Program.

Without the support of everyone in our communities that have created these legacies the Interlake Community Foundation would not be able to give back over **\$424,000** in total funding this year.

If anyone wishes to start a new fund to support a special part of your community or project dear to you, we are willing to work out a package that will provide an ongoing legacy.

The application forms for local charities to apply for a community grant is found on our website. The deadline is February 14th of each year.



#### Report from Murray Slagerman, Marketing Chair

Marketing committee members Meechelle Best, Ross Thompson, Peggy Linklater, Sandra Smith, Tracy Holod, and myself developed a marketing plan for annual board approval to promote the foundation movement, inform the public of grant opportunities and bring awareness of ICF efforts to support charities in our community.

Our social media presence on Facebook and Instagram engages our 1,984 followers with a range of topics celebrating our grants, scholarship recipients and promoting events such as the Endow MB Giving Challenge with videos of fund-stakeholders highlighting charitable efforts in our area. A "pop-up grant" challenged our communities to vote for their choice of grant to receive an extra \$500!

We recognize new funds in local media with terrific support from the Stonewall-Teulon Tribune publishing articles on the Ralph Eichler Legacy Fund, Standard Limestone Quarries Fund and Stephanie Oland Duncan Memorial Fund to name just a few. Ads are placed to inform the public of events such as Grant Application Notice and the AGM.
